

UN secretary-general meets with Rotary leaders

United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon met with Rotary leaders and praised Rotarians for their commitment to polio eradication during a recent visit to Chicago.

"Rotary International has led a worldwide campaign to wipe out polio. Sometime soon, their work will be done. Polio will be history, like smallpox," Ban said in an address to the Economic Club of Chicago on 7 February.

At a private ceremony earlier in the day, Rotary International President Wilfrid J. Wilkinson presented Ban with the Rotary International Award of Honor in recognition of his support for polio eradication and his dedication to furthering peace and cross-cultural understanding. Past recipients of this high Rotary honor include Kofi Annan, Bill Clinton, Mikhail Gorbachev, and Nelson Mandela.

The secretary-general also met with Foundation Trustee Chair Robert S. Scott, RI General Secretary Edwin H. Futa, and RI President-elect Dong Kurn Lee. Ban and Lee, both South Koreans, are friends.

Rotary's close ties with the UN date back to 1945 when 49 Rotarians helped draft the UN charter. Rotary continues to collaborate with the UN through the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, a partnership with the United Nation's Children's Fund, the World Health Organization, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

This month in Rotary history: Rotary's anniversary

During the first Rotary club meeting on 23 February 1905 in Chicago, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Hiram Shorey, and Silvester Schiele met to talk about their personal experiences. Harris then unfolded his general plan for their club meetings.

This was the simple beginning of the world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago. It was created because of Harris' wish to capture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The Rotary name derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices.

Rotarians continue to take pride in their history. In honor of that first club, Rotarians have preserved its original meeting place, Room 711 in Chicago's Unity Building, by re-creating the office as it existed in 1905. For several years, the Paul Harris 711 Club maintained the room as a shrine for visiting Rotarians. In 1989, when the building was scheduled to be demolished, the club carefully dismantled the office and salvaged the interior, including doors and radiators. In 1993, the RI Board of Directors set aside a permanent home for the restored Room 711 at RI World Headquarters in the Chicago suburb of Evanston.



Rotarians take a (healthy) bite out of hunger

Waste Not. Want Not could be the motto of District 5030's First Harvest project. The statewide program collects farmers' surplus produce and makes it available to food banks throughout Washington, USA. Since 1982, more than 120 million pounds of fruits and vegetables have been contributed.

With a staff of three and an annual budget of less than \$300,000, First Harvest Executive Director David Bobanick works with food donors, trucking companies, and food bank distribution warehouses to bring nutritious produce to Washington's hungry.

"We have to be opportunistic," says the member of the Rotary Club of Mercer Island. "Food donations typically drive the process, but sometimes we hear of a truck that's available, and our challenge becomes to find food to fill the truck."

Food banks often cannot obtain or store fruits and vegetables. which are perishable and typically expensive. By rescuing produce that would otherwise go to waste, First Harvest allows the facilities to offer food that promotes health and helps prevent disease.

Rotary club involvement has been key to the program's success, adds Bobanick. All 55 clubs in District 5030 provide financial support and have members on First Harvest's board. Rotarian farmers, truckers, and food bank staff also donate their services to the project.

"I would like to see Rotarians around the country get involved in eliminating hunger," Bobanick says. To that end, First Harvest has created Visit our website www.coec.biz a CD-ROM for Rotarians interested in starting similar efforts.

Clubs in Florida and Oregon already have launched First Harvest projects, and the participating Rotarians there are no less enthusiastic. "Hunger should not exist!" says Sharon Parks, a member of the Rotary Club of Klamath County, Oregon, and board president of the District 5110 (California; Oregon) First Harvest project. "I believe that through Rotary, hunger can be conquered."
