

Robert Aubey, PhD spoke to us about online MBA programs.

Notes from the February 14 program:

Our program today was on the growth (or maybe explosion) in on-line education, focusing on business MBA programs and changes over the years.

Speaker Robert Aubey, PhD, has taught at the university level since 1966. His background includes a doctorate in business finance from UCLA. Over the years at the University of Wisconsin at Madison, he was Director of the Center for International Business Research, Director of the Semester Abroad

program, and Chairman of the International Business Department. During 1972-73, he was a Fulbright Scholar teaching economics at the National Polytechnic Institute in Mexico City.

He retired in 1998, but in 2001 began work for Walden University, and in 2007, added Baker College too. Walden University is unusual – it has a "virtual" campus, that is, its classes are all on-line. Baker College is in Flint Michigan and is geared to the automobile industry and its business needs.

The Masters in Business Administration (MBA) program has evolved quite a bit over the years. It used to be that students would enroll immediately after completing their bachelor's degree. At that time, the focus was on US based business, where now the program is more international in scope. Also, it used to focus on "how to do business." But after the 1970's, globalization of business expanded with new methods and interaction with many cultures and business systems. Thus, the MBA programs emphasized international business more.

Therefore, U. of Wisconsin revamped its MBA to require business grads to work at least six years in the business world before accepting them into the program. That became the model – business experienced people returning for their MBA. Then an "executive MBA" program developed. This was geared to top-level management who might not have graduated with a business degree, and couldn't give up two years to go back to school.

Through Internet classes, the instructor can be in Wisconsin or Oxnard – it doesn't matter. Dr. Aubey has a couple students in Africa, one in Europe and has others from around the world.

How can the instructor know the student actually did their own work? There is software which will compare the students' work with a whole library of written papers. If the work is too close and looks like plagiarism, further review will be done.

Thanks, Dr. Aubey, for a very interesting explanation of current trends and Internet instruction.

Google gives Rotary US\$3.5 million to help end polio

Rotary International has received a US\$3.5 million challenge grant from the Google Foundation, a nonprofit managed by Google.org, in support of Rotary's top goal to eradicate polio worldwide. Rotary will raise funds to match the Google Foundation grant dollar-for-dollar over one year.

The grant and matching funds will directly support polio immunization activities carried out by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), a partnership spearheaded by the World Health Organization, Rotary International, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

"Following the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation's \$100 million grant to Rotary in November, Google.org represents another response to the call for support by Rotary and its partners to finish polio," says Dr. Robert S. Scott, trustee chair of The Rotary Foundation. "Both challenge grants reflect strong confidence in Rotary's leadership role in working relentlessly to help achieve this vital public health goal for the world's children."

Eradicating polio has been Rotary's number-one priority since 1985. To date, Rotary has helped immunize nearly two billion children and contributed \$650 million to the GPEI, a figure that will rise to more than \$850 million by the time the world is certified polio-free.

Globally, the number of polio cases has fallen from 350,000 annually in the mid-1980s to approximately 2,000 cases in 2006. The GPEI has succeeded in slashing the number of cases by 99 percent and decreased the number of polio-endemic countries from 125 to just 4: Afghanistan, India, Nigeria, and Pakistan.

"This grant comes at a crucial time for the initiative, as more funds are needed to reach children in the most challenging regions of the world," says RI President Wilfrid J. Wilkinson. "We have the technical tools to beat polio, and we're almost there. All we need is for the rest of the world to follow the Google Foundation's lead in supporting the effort to eradicate this vaccine-preventable disease once and for all."


