Presidents Message ...



Deborah Roberts President 2008-2009

Because I've had so many questions from many of you these few months about what's appropriate and what's not for invocations, I thought I'd see what Clifford L. Dotcherman, Past RI President had to say on the subject. Below are his thoughts and RI policy,

"INVOCATIONS AT CLUB MEETINGS

In many Rotary clubs, particularly in Judeo-Christian nations, it is customary to open weekly meetings with an appropriate invocation or blessing. Usually such invocations are offered without reference to specific religious denominations or faiths.

Rotary policy recognizes that throughout the world Rotarians represent many religious beliefs, ideas and creeds. The religious beliefs of each member are fully respected, and nothing in Rotary is intended to prevent each individual from being faithful to such convictions.

At international assemblies and conventions, it is traditional for a silent invocation to be given. In respect for all religious beliefs and in the spirit of tolerance for a wide variety of personal faiths, all persons are invited to seek divine guidance and peace "each in his own way." It is an inspiring experience to join with thousands of Rotarians in an international "silent prayer" or act of personal devotion. Usually all Rotary International board and committee meetings begin with a few moments of silent meditation. In this period of silence, Rotary demonstrates respect for the beliefs of all members, who represent the religions of the world.

Since each Rotary club is autonomous, the practice of presenting a prayer or invocation at club meetings is left entirely to the traditions and customs of the individual club, with the understanding that these meeting rituals always be conducted in a manner which will respect the religious convictions and faiths of all members."

So there you have it. It is in fact appropriate to reference your religious beliefs/denomination, or someone else's, when giving the invocation/ inspirational moment so long as it is respectful and, of course, meets the 4-Way test.

On another note, a GREAT BIG THANK YOU to all who participated in the joint meeting with **The Rotary Club of Ojai** on Friday. That program will stick with me for a long time to come. A few of you have asked if we are going to be involved in the actual fundraiser in April. & Rotary Recognition

(instead of fines): Tom Shilton. Tom fined himself first for advertising his church's Genealogy Program. No one got any recognition for correct answers...(so you don't know about your ancestors???)

The program was introduced by **Rocky Ludes**. It featured **Mel Cheatham**.

Dr. Mel Cheatham spoke to us about his recent trips to North Korea. His humanitarian work began about 24 years ago. He has worked in hospitals in trouble spots around the world, including Africa, Eastern Europe, Central and South America, and Asia. Today his focus is more on diplomatic efforts to bring aid to countries such as North Korea.


His first trip to North Korea was 11 years ago. In that country, it's not possible to raise sufficient food for their 23 million inhabitants due to the geography and weather. The former USSR had been providing food and other aid, but that support ended almost 20 years ago.

About 1.2 million people are in their military, many of whom are in the demilitarized zone. In 1992, their nuclear program was built up. We saw slides of a few spectacular (and chilling) military displays.

Only one flight per week goes into North Korea, by means of an older Russian aircraft. Once you're in, you had better not get sick, because you will not get out for a week. He showed pictures and described some hospitals without running water, with liquor bottles used for IV lines (and shared needles), and no electricity. Nurses use a series of mirrors to direct outside light to the operating table.

In 1997, they found that 2-3 million North Koreans with active tuberculosis, most of whom were shut off in isolated clinics. However, six months of treatment by pill will result in a very high cure rate. One wealthy person in the eastern US paid the

\$385,000 cost for the first phase of these treatments. Mel was instrumental in arranging for a 747 with over 90 tons of relief supplies to be flown to North Korea. This was the first US cargo plane to carry supplies.

Mel's diplomatic work includes meeting regularly with the North Korean Ambassador at the United Nations and the Minister of Health to find ways to assist the North Koreans. His trip to North Korea in mid-July was part of an advance delegation for Franklin Graham, head of Samaritan's Purse. This resulted in some projects to add electricity to hospitals and provide mobile medical clinics.

The closing few pictures were of children in Darfur – a reminder that people are suffering by the millions, and that some young children are being raised up to be terrorists. But he had also shown pictures of a few women suffering from TB, responding to his own smile and theirs.

Thank you, Dr. Cheatham, for your tireless humanitarian work! == Rocky




