Designated Fund giving, such as to Polio Plus, goes for that purpose only. However, giving to the Foundation's Undesignated Fund results in 50% of the donation will return to the local Rotary District three years later. These funds can be designated for projects of various Rotary Clubs within the District. Over the last few years, most Foundation giving through this District have gone to Designated Funds rather than undesignated fund giving. This means the District can expect much smaller returns from the Foundation in three years.

The Rotary Foundation will be changing its system, and our District will be in the new pilot program. The goal will change to emphasize much larger grants, i.e. 80,000 and up. This is 5 - 10 times larger than most current projects. Marc emphasized that Rotary's work is not primarily responding to local emergencies, such as hurricanes, floods and famine relief, but to support major projects that have multiple benefits, such as the eradication of polio or malaria, water purification and education.

He gave an example of a project in Mexico involving ten cities and various Rotary Clubs, resulting in awards of 10 computers to each of 10 schools in these cities. During this project, Rotary membership and giving increased within the ten cities.


He concluded his PowerPoint presentation with some troubling slides showing examples of poverty and starvation, and challenging us to stop complaining about small inconveniences and step up to make a difference through undesignated contributions to the Foundation.

Interact club sends school supplies to

U.S. Interactors are honoring a classmate who died in a car accident in 2006 by fulfilling her vision of distributing school supplies to children in Mexico.

The Interact Club of Etna Union High School in Northern California has distributed over 400 backpacks filled with crayons, scissors, paper, and other supplies to grade school students in places like Ensenada and Tixkokob.

The project was first envisioned by club member Antonia Cornell-Banke,

who came up with the idea after several trips to Mexico with the school's Spanish club.

"I knew her as a really caring person who was really involved in the community," says Javier Hansen, president of the Etna Interact club and member of the Spanish club.

After Antonia's death, fellow Interactors her their new backpacks. Courtesy of Javier Hansen carried out her vision.


naming the project "Toni's Backpacks" in her honor.

Members of the Spanish club have helped out, distributing the school supplies during their annual trip to Mexico.

"It's become a favorite part of their trip. When they finish handing out the backpacks, they want to be a part of Interact too," says Davie Martin, a member of the Rotary Club of Scott Valley (Ft. Jones) and adviser to the Etna Interact club. Martin helps the Interactors connect with Rotary clubs in Mexico to find schools in need of the supplies.

The Interact club raises funds to support the project by organizing charity basketball games between the school's varsity boys' team and a local law enforcement team. They also solicit support for the project throughout the community; US\$20 sends a backpack loaded with supplies to a student in Mexico.

Toni's Backpacks is now in its third year. The project has inspired other regional Interact and Rotaract clubs to start their own backpack programs.

German Rotarians team up with publisher on book project

Rotary clubs in Germany have teamed up with science book publisher Wissen Media to release a 192-page book highlighting Rotary projects that are saving lives and improving the living conditions of people in the world.

Blue Planet: Together for a Better World was unveiled at the RI presidential membership conference in Vienna in December.

The book project was initiated by the Rotary Club of Dorfen.

The book includes 77 groundbreaking Rotary club projects and discusses the vital contribution of volunteers in helping to address global challenges, such as natural disasters, epidemics, climate change, conflicts, and war.

"Initially, we just wanted to publish a photo book in a small edition to present our club projects and raise funds for PolioPlus," says Matthias

Lange, who coordinated the project with his wife, Ute, also a Rotarian. The couple, who own a TV production company, consulted with the publisher of Wissen Media who suggested adding editorial content.

"After a brainstorm we realized that this could grow into a bigger, more ambitious project, and we invited all German clubs to join," says Lange.

In the following months, dozens of clubs submitted project descriptions. The German-language Rotary regional magazine and Rotary International staff provided additional content and photos to illustrate international projects. District 1840 (part of Austria; Germany) also received an RI Public Relations Grant for the book project.

A portion of the proceeds from sale of the book, available in Germany and through the German language Web site www.buchprojekt.org, will benefit PolioPlus.
