Terry McBreen then conducted our raffle and the lucky winner was Danielle Brinkman!

Our program today was focused on two of our Avenues of Service: Vocational Service and New Generations.

Bill Spellman began the discussion on Vocational Service. In the past, our Club sponsored one or two Job Shadows, involving about 30 high school students. But this program is now under New Generations. We still have occasional Craft Talks, where a Rotarian will tell about their vocation and new issues. These have been abbreviated recently, about five minutes long. Bill would like to see these lengthened to maybe a full program. Outside of this, he is looking for other activities related to Vocational Service.

Mark Smith, aided by one of his faithful Interactors from Ventura High School, gave us a PowerPoint presentation entitled <u>You Can Make A Difference</u>. Mark distributed red cards to show what Interact had distributed to the elderly at a convalescent hospital and retirement home. They recently had the introductory meetings at Buena High School in their auditorium, with about 82 students attending last week. Some of their programs:

• Visiting four senior citizen facilities under the "Adopt a Grandparent" program. Meeting, cont'd from page 3

- Mentoring program for Portola elementary school. Called Buena Buddies, the high schoolers work with the younger kids beginning with a little recreation after school, then get down to tutoring. Even some Buena grads continue to do this very popular program. They also sponsor a Christmas party at Portola, including giving out gifts.
- Participate in the Rose Parade float decoration.
- Present a Welcome Luncheon for the German exchange students visiting Buena High School for a month.
- Participate in Funny Money Auctions at Interact meetings, raising money from baked goods.
- In the works: Buena has some very handicapped students. In development are plans are to set up a "secret pals" program.
- Mark expressed thanks to Rotary East for our support, including the amazing Bake Auction held in May.
- Mark noted that last year's attendance at Interact averaged over 40 students per meeting.

Cheney Caldwell then talked about our community based Rotaract Club. There are about 33 members on the roster, and they are adding 1-2 members per week.

- Their first fundraiser was a special engagement movie about the loss of dolphins in the fishing industry it raised \$2,800 at the screening.
- They will be the crossing guards for the Ojai Chili Cookoff.
- They will assist Rotary East with Nightmare on the Hill.
- For the Ventura Club, they will be working on shelter domes at Riverhaven.

9 members are planning to go to India for National Immunization Day in February. To raise money, they will:

- Participate in an endurance challenge a ¹/₂ marathon, 13 miles in San Francisco.
- Ventura Comedy Club will have a charity night, and split half the proceeds on up to 200 tickets.
- Create a local "Red Run" which is a 5-k, with booths, food and





As а current Rotaractor. past а participant her in district's Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program, and a former Foundation Rotarv Ambassadorial Scholar, she is hoping her experiences serve as a springboard into Rotary.

"In Rotary, I will have a variety of service possibilities available to me. locally and internationally," Tirone says. "There is so much diversity in the work Rotary does. It can give vou exposure to so many different areas, and help

she sought out its Rotaract club and joined, becoming club president in 2005-06. Her club volunteered in the community but focused much of its time and resources on raising funds for a literacy project in India, working with a sister club and Rotarians to help implement the effort.

"Being involved with Rotaract opened my eyes to the ability to connect with Rotaractors all over the world," says Tirone. "Finding out that Rotary has very strong ties to the rest of the world was very appealing."

In 2008, Tirone became an Ambassadorial Scholar, majoring in political science at the University of KwaZulu-Natal in Durban, South Africa. During that time, her host Rotary club helped establish the Rotaract Club of Durban Berea.

As an honorary member of the Durban Berea club, she embarked on an international project with 19 other club members, raising US\$2,000 to help renovate a school in Ponta do Ouro, Mozambique. The Rotaractors spent a week cleaning and painting classrooms and installing a vegetable garden.

Tirone says she plans on becoming a Rotarian but wants to stay in Rotaract as long as possible.

"Rotary for me is for life, so I want to be able to experience as much of Rotaract as I can," she says. "Because of it, I have friends all over the world."

Tirone says Rotaract is good for Rotary.

"When it comes to encouraging new members or bringing in new and innovative ideas, Rotary can always rely on Rotaractors to be the people who bring those types of ideas to clubs."
