

Operation Splash began when Jeff

Hata asked Margo what the YMCA would do with a donation from our Club. Margo posed the question to her colleagues. Through their brainstorming efforts, the YMCA staff decided that they wanted to provide swim instruction to homeless children and children from low-income families. Upon hearing about the idea, our Club increased its donation and Operation Splash was born.

Operation Splash is presented during the eight weeks of summer. Children from six months old to teenagers are brought in from a variety of places including the Kingdom Center, Project Understanding, Salvation Army, Nyeland Acres, and the Ventura Unified School District.

Each child is given a swimsuit, towel, and goggles. Swimsuit drives have been held at the Centers for Family Health, and the County of Ventura Human Services Agencies. Currently, the YMCA has many swimsuits for the program, but are in need of towels (beach or bath towels are fine).

The children are taught a variety of things including, stroke development, personal safety, core values, water sports and games, and rescue techniques.

The Ventura Family YMCA staff has been so inspired by Operation Splash, that it has started two other programs: Operation Senior and Operation Kick.

Operation Senior is sponsored by the Ventura Downtown Rotary Club. This program brings seniors in to use the therapy pool.

Operation Kick is sponsored by Floyd and Erin Gill.

This program offers soccer training to homeless and low-income children. The YMCA is working to coordinate Operation Splash with Operation Kick so that the children can do both at each visit. The YMCA has graciously been given tickets to a Galaxy soccer game and will be taking the children later in the summer.

The Channel Islands YMCAAssociation recently recognized Operation Splash with its Program Excellence Award. Nationally, the YMCA organization is praising the success of Operation Splash. The hope is that other YMCAs will start similar

- Member Directory will be available to all members online. Need someone's phone number? Log in to clubrunner and you will be able to get it.
- Attendance Manager, we will be applying bar codes to the backs of all your badges and you will be able to "swipe" yourself in. No more having to mark you off on a list and then manually calculate attendance each month. You will also be able to log into clubrunner and check your attendance at any time.
- eBulletin will be replacing our constant contact eBulletin.
- Committees Management will allow our Avenues of Service, Fund Raising Committes, or Board of Directors or any other committee we define to keep their activities posted on line.
- Photo Albums will be available for all of our events.
- Event Calendar & Planner is one of the most exciting features. We will be able to post our upcoming events online and you will be able to go to the website and sign up for the events instead of having to sign up on a clipboard. You will then receive an email notification that you have signed up.

I will tell you that I was skeptical of the value of Clubrunner, but now that I am working with it, I love it and am embracing it completely! More information to follow and we will be dedicating a program to clubrunner in the near future.

Linking New Generations programs keeps participants on track to becoming Rotarians

A mentoring program in District 5160 (California, USA) helps incoming college freshmen – particularly those who are Interact alumni - get connected with university-based Rotaractors. It's just one example of the efforts undertaken by many districts to keep Interactors, Rotaractors, RYLArians, and Rotary Youth Exchange participants in the fold – and on track to become Rotarians.

"It's important to recapture people who fall through the holes, such as an Interactor who graduates from high school, moves away to college, and has trouble finding a Rotaract club," says Joanna Kwong, Rotaract District 5160 representative. "We often refer alumni or recent graduates

to the next relevant program. Interactors pool from RYLA and Youth Exchange, and Rotaractors seek membership from former Interactors."

Jim Cambier, past president of the Rotary Club of Danville, California, says that building relationships between New Generations programs is the first step toward ensuring successful transitions.

"Whether it's Interact, Rotaract, RYLA, or Youth Exchange, it's important to

let everyone know that these programs all flow together," says Cambier. "When they see the whole connection, they can really understand just how multifaceted New Generations Service is."

To make the transitions seamless, District 5160 is also setting up a district alumni database to track Interactors and Rotaractors in order to link them with a New Generations group, whether within or outside the district.

Here's what other districts are doing to cross-promote New Generations programs:

- * Rob Newman, Rotary Youth Exchange chair for District 7450 (Pennsylvania), arranged a day of international exchange to forge a connection between the Rotaract Club of Philadelphia and Youth Exchange students.
- * Alana Wilson, president of the Rotaract Club of Gunargarang, New South Wales, Australia, and a former Youth Exchange student, attended RYLA seminars in her district after she joined Rotaract. She says having someone already involved in New Generations reach out to potential participants helps bridge the gaps between programs.
- * Mat Matson, RYLA chair for District 5450 (Colorado), says his district always includes a presentation on Interact at its RYLA conferences. He notes that most of the 29 Interact clubs in the district were started by former RYLA participants.

- 1. Entries: Registration starts at 7:30 and is accepted until 8:15 am on the day of the match. Shooting starts at 8:30 sharp.
- 2. All shooting will be from the bench
- 3. There will be three prizes at 100, 200 and 300 yards.
- 4. Any Rifle up to .30 Calibers is acceptable, regardless of weight.
- 5. Each of the 100 entrants will be required to state whether he is competing for the 100,200 or 300-yard prize.
- 6. Every shooter will be allowed 2 practice shots at the steel target (if desired by the shooter) and then 5 shots in a row at the paper targets for scoring.
- 7. Once the 100-yard round is finished, there will be a cut to 24.
- 8. The highest 100 yard score who signed up for the 100yard competition will win the prize for the 100-yard.
- 9. Once the 200- yard is finished, there will be a cut to 8. The highest 200 yard score who signed up for the 200-yard competition wins the 200-yard prize.
- 10. The 8 shooters competing for the 300-yard prize will win based on the highest 300-yard score. Scoring will not be cumulative though the range.
- 11. In the event that there are 6 shots on the target, the highest scoring shot will be eliminated.
- 12. The shooter will only have 7 minutes including practice at each range, this will ensure getting though the entire field of shooters fairly quickly.
