Speaker Notes December 28

At today's joint meeting with the Ventura, Ventura South and Ventura East Rotary Clubs, we had the pleasure of hearing John Zeretzke talk about his organization, Flutes Across the World.

John immediately captivated us as he began his presentation. He played a very small flute – very high like a piccolo – and made it sound like bird calls. Incredible. He used electronic reverberation to set up a repeating background, then switched to a Hawaiian Nose Flute and played a different melody to his own accompaniment. It all sounded very tribal and was very beautify.

John explained that most people groups throughout history have used flutes. His program involves teaching children about flutes in various cultures, then helping the children make flutes. They make two: one to keep and one to give away to another child somewhere around the world. The kids make flutes out of bamboo or plastic pipe and then hand decorate them.

We were shown slides of individual children who had received a flute. Many held it close as a prized possession. Each donated flute has a tag showing the name and picture of the boy or girl who made it. For Prati, in Nepal, the flute is a symbol of hope and also a wonderful gift. Prakash's

hand is partially paralyzed, but he runs it across the flute holes to help him make music. Durga in Nepal has dwarfism, but now he can make some music.

The flute music has an amazing ability to relax and sooth children who are facing operations, such as for cleft palate correction. The doctors who came into the ward asked what had happened to the children. They were all relaxed with some even sleeping. They wanted to bring that experience to all their patients.

John and his team have been in some dangerous areas of the world. They have had support from the United Nations peacekeeping forces or other military protection. He has had generals come up to him and thank him, saying "this is what we need more of in the world."

He finished up his talk by playing a Philippines bamboo mouth harp – very different than any mouth harp you ever heard before.

New phone scam targets Rotarians

Anumber of Rotarians have received phone calls from someone impersonating RI President Kalyan Banerjee or his assistant, claiming he was stuck at an airport and needed the recipient to send money to help.

This phone scam has been reported to authorities in Australia and the Philippines, where the calls appeared to originate. Calls are now being reported in Hawaii, USA, and the scam may continue to spread.

Please be aware of these other scams:


An email scam targeting Rotarians and Rotaractors claims the recipient has won hundreds of thousands of euros through an international promotional program conducted by the "Euro-Millones Lottery". Attached to the e-mail is a PDF letter signed by "Luis Alberto, Vice President" with a photo of Past RI President Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar.

An email scam with the subject line "Dear Award Beneficiary!!!" has targeted Rotarians claiming the recipient has won US\$500,000 and two HP laptops from RI. The email asks for contact information and is signed by "Mrs. Sarah Olic, Programme Co-ordinator, Rotary International".

RI encourages Rotarians and Rotary clubs to avoid becoming victims of such scams by deleting any e-mail that appears suspicious.
