## **Presidents Message ...**

Fellow Rotarians:

As many of you know, I spent the last week visiting with Jan and Pam Lindsay on a brief but colorful trip seeing just what GoCare does in Nicaragua. It turns out we do so much and to capture it all, we were traveling along with a film crew to capture to make a documentary about the different projects.

GoCare, for those of you who don't know, is the organization founded by the Lindsay's that

administers the preschool, Lindsay Community Center and the other vocational programs in Granada and surrounding areas. It's no small undertaking by any means: Full time administrative staff plus onsite staff at the different locations with hundreds of children and adults in the various programs. GoCare runs an annual budget of approximately \$250,000, which RCVE helps support, and that money goes a long way in Nicaragua which is currently the second poorest country in the hemisphere behind Haiti.

What stood out in my mind as so surprising about GoCare's work was the size of the program, the diversity of the programs, and finally the sustainability of the project. The project's size is large: Within a relatively small geographic area we visited three separate vocational venues where computer classes, a sewing school and English classes were going on. We also visited another pre-school that Tom Crozier was instrumental in constructing and a large community center. The diversity of the programs was quite unique too because the programs ranged from teaching young children basic reading skills to middle aged women learning sewing skills as a new career. The sustainability of the program was also surprising: Every graduate from the GoCare program is asked to work onsite at the various projects as their way of giving back to their community and GoCare.

I would strongly encourage everyone to go and visit Nicaragua. Good deeds are being done there, the people are friendly and the rum is outstanding. Jan and Pam Lindsay were also great hosts and I give many thanks to their wonderful hospitality! I will be giving the Club a more detailed description of all this in later months as a Club Program.

As always, make it a great week!



Deborah Perkins introduced our speaker Jonathon Light.

Jonathon Fraser Light gave a presentation titled "Legal and Business Pitfalls That Can Decrease Your Bottom Line and Increase Your Blood Pressure." Mr. Light is very active in the community working with such organizations as the Ventura County Bar Association, Volunteer Legal Services Association, Ventura County Taxpayers Association, Ventura County Boy Scout Council and the Channel Islands Ballet. He is the author of the award winning book "The Cultural Encyclopedia of Baseball." Mr. Light practices employment law at his firm Light Gabler Law in Camarillo.

One of the first things a business can do to protect itself is to purchase employment practices liability insurance (EPLI). This will cover many things except for wage and hour claims and punitive damages. Be sure to get coverage for employee theft which happens all the time.

Mr. Light recommends entering into an arbitration agreement with your employees. The result is that any dispute you have will not be heard before a jury. It would be heard by a private arbitrator outside of court. Jury trials are expensive to conduct and often result in high awards against the employer so it is good to avoid them. Offer, but do not force, current employees the option of signing an arbitration agreement. With new hires, send the agreement with the offer letter and do not hire them unless they sign the agreement.

Business documents and website content need to be continually updated.



Jonathon Light spoke to us about the pitfalls of running a business.

For example, review the written terms and conditions that you have on your invoices and vendor contracts.

Employee performance reviews can be helpful if the employee later sues the company. As a result, Mr. Light recommends that you actually write out your comments as opposed to just rating the employee on a number scale. As part of this process, you can also ask your employees what you do that helps them and what you do that does not help them. This feedback can be used to create a more productive team.

# Fifty years of Rotary Youth Exchange in Japan

When Yoko Sekimoto arrived in Melbourne that year as Japan's first Rotary Youth Exchange student, she didn't realize that many people were wary of her visit. Fifty years later, she continues to marvel at the graciousness of her hosts.

"Everyone treated me like a daughter or sister. It was only 17 years after the war, but I felt a warm welcome and great hospitality," says Sekimoto (her married name – at the time, she was Yoko Miyazaki).

Japan's Youth Exchange program began with help from an Australian Rotarian. Don Farquhar addressed the 1961 RI Convention in Tokyo about the need to build friendships and cultural understanding throughout the world – particularly with Japan. He considered student exchange to be the best way to do that.

"Don was a person of both immense courage and foresight," says Stuart McDonald, program development officer for Youth Exchange in Australia. "In 1942, during World War II, Don was blinded in action against the Japanese. However, he maintained a desire and a mission in life to promote peace and goodwill."

After Farquhar delivered his speech, he was approached by a Japanese district governor, who asked him to help arrange the first Youth Exchange involving a student from Japan. The Rotary clubs of Rosebud and Kurume coordinated Sekimoto's year abroad. A few weeks after her arrival, another group of Japanese students came to Sydney, and the next year Japan welcomed several Australian students. The country's exchange program had officially begun.

Sekimoto's visit to Australia, along with the beginning of Youth Exchange in Japan, was considered so historically significant that photographs from her exchange are now housed in the National Archives of Australia, McDonald says

"It was a hard time for Japan when I was 16," Sekimoto says. "When I came to Australia, it was just like heaven. It was such a different style of living. That became a big turning point for me – it completely changed my life."

Her experience as an exchange student awakened a curiosity to explore the rest of the world. After returning home to finish high school and college, Sekimoto worked as a flight attendant, married, and lived in Egypt before going back to Japan.

"Yoko's story is just one great example of Youth Exchange," McDonald says. "Fifty years later, thousands of friendships have been formed between people from all over the world and Japan."
