Presidents Message ...

Fellow Rotarians:

As many of you know, RYLA, or Rotary Youth Leadership Awards program is right around the corner. It's a District 5240 event that happens every year in our own back yard here in Ojai at Camp Ramah on Fairview Road which is off of the 33 Highway. It's a local event for our Club but it's also a program that occurs throughout the world and thousands of young people attend the multi day events. This years' local District 5240 four day event is coming up and is April 18th to the 21st. Bill Spellman is this years' RYLA Chair and with his help we'll be well prepared for the event.

RYLA was first adopted by Rotary International in 1971. Each Rotary Club in the District, 61 Clubs, participates as young people are chosen for their leadership potential to attend an all-expenses-paid camp to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice. Rotary clubs and districts select participants and facilitate the event's curriculum. The goal of the event, from RYLA's website is to: 1. Provide an effective training experience for selected youth and potential leaders; 2. Encourage leadership of youth by youth; 3. Encourage youth to make a difference in their communities through volunteer work and social responsibility; and Demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth. It's an ambitious program to say the least!

How we participate as a Club is in two direct ways: We provide youth volunteers in the area that are sophmores or juniors in local high schools and we also provide counselors from our Club membership to be at the multi day event. Each Rotary Club has varying numbers of students that they elect to pay for and send each year. Our Club has elected to send six participants. At this time we are currently looking for both students and counselors for this years' event. If you have friends or family that would like to attend, or if you would like to participate as a counselor, please see Bill Spellman.

There are important dates to remember and they are outlined below from the RYLA website:

January 31st. Each Club Level RYLA chairperson should be sure that all selected RYLA candidates have completed their online registration.

February 15th. All required parent signatures should be sent in. It is the duty of the Club Level RYLA chairperson to look on the RYLA website to see if all parent forms are received by RYLA District staff. (Registration is NOT complete until all forms are turned in)

February 15th. All Rotarians volunteering for RYLA must register online and acknowledge that they must attend a training day. Not everyone who volunteers is guaranteed to be called upon.

March 1st. All selected volunteers must have their background consent forms in. More information about RYLA can be found at: http://www.ryla5240.org/

I hope everyone looks forward to this exciting yearly event and will participate if at all possible.





Today's guest speaker was Greg Woodburn, who spoke to us about a program he started called Give Running.

Greg is a runner. He loves to run. He was a 4-year distance runner and 2012 Distance Team Captain of the USC Men's Track & Field Team. A few years back he had a few injuries and realized that, although running is hard, not running is harder. During his recuperation, he thought about helping other people.

He began an effort to collect used running shoes to give to those less fortunate. His initial goal was for 100 pairs of shoes. He received over 500 pair! With that start, he decided to make this a year-

round endeavor. A nonprofit corporation was created and he promoted the concept to several universities. To date, over 13,500 pair of shoes have been received and given out.

On a trip to Mali, he was able to personally donate shoes to people, including the chief of a tribe. The chief thanked him and said he could now play soccer with the children! They had brought 113 pair and the people were excited. The next day, he ran laps around a loop that went through the village. The first few laps he was alone, then some kids joined him. In the end, about 20 were with him. But one young man had to stop at a place where there were rocks – because he had no shoes. Greg found the young man's feet were the same size as his, so he gave him his own running shoes. (Way to go!)

Greg was in Ghana a year ago, and explained their organization emphasizes character traits too: goal setting, leadership development, and personal best efforts. They made a pyramid of cardboard boxes that had Coach Wooden's pyramid of success on it.

If you would like to donate running (or walking) shoes, you can do so at Inside Track or CMH Fast Track fitness center.

Greg will be part of our Rotary District's Group Study Exchange to Sri Lanka, from February 10 – March 12. We'll have to have him back to talk about his trip.

Thank you, Greg, for a very inspirational program on your humanitarian work.


'Engage Rotary, Change Lives' is 2013-14 RI theme

RI President-elect Ron Burton will ask Rotarians to Engage Rotary, Change Lives in 2013-14.

He unveiled the RI theme during the opening plenary session of the 2013 International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, the annual training event for incoming district governors.

"If we really want to take Rotary service forward, then we must make sure that every single Rotarian has the same feeling about Rotary that each one of us here has today," Burton said. "We need to make sure that every Rotarian has



a meaningful role to play, that they're all making a contribution, and that their contribution is valued."

Burton said the July launch of The Rotary Foundation's new grant model, Future Vision, makes it an exciting time to be a Rotarian. He said the new grant model, which has been used by about 100 pilot districts since 2010, represents a new era for the Foundation, and will help Rotarians get excited about Rotary's ability to change lives.

"It takes everything that is wonderful about Rotary and raises it to a new level — by encouraging bigger, more sustainable projects while providing increased flexibility for local projects, both of which address the needs of the community being served," he said.

Burton asked the incoming district governors to take the lead in helping their clubs through the transition, with the assistance of their district Rotary Foundation chairs, who also attended the assembly this year. The training sessions are focusing heavily on equipping these leaders to go back to their districts as experts on the new grant model.

Before the assembly, Burton asked each of the incoming governors to make a donation in their name to The Rotary Foundation in order to demonstrate leadership by example. At the assembly, he announced that all 537 governors-elect had complied; along with donations from all RI Board Meeting, cont'd on page 6



members and Foundation Trustees, the contributions totaled US\$675,412.

"Now, I have to believe that some of this is money that The Rotary Foundation probably would not have received had I not asked. And I think that this is an important lesson" he said. "If you want somebody else to do something, you can just sit around and wait for them to get the idea, or you can ask."

Burton applied that lesson also to membership development, which he insisted is the responsibility of every Rotarian. He told the audience that although he had been an active member of the Key Club, a youth program of Kiwanis International, he went on to join Rotary simply because the Rotary Club of Norman, Oklahoma, invited him to.

"You have to ask," he said.

But Burton emphasized that the job doesn't end when a new member joins: "It's not done until that new member is engaged in Rotary, inspired by Rotary, and uses the power of Rotary service to change lives."

Thank you to all those at United for their generosity and the opportunity to participate in United's 10 Million Charity Miles Giveaway. And thank you to everyone who voted for us. We couldn't have done it without your participation and persistence.

For the miles giveaway, we officially came in second place and will receive 2,501,338 charity miles from United. Rotarians will use the miles for humanitarian missions, such as transporting sick children to hospitals and National Immunization Days for polio eradication. Last year, Rotary received 2,488,070 charity miles from the giveaway. Miles aren't used for travel for RI staff or Rotary senior leaders.
