Remembering Arlene "Tootie" Gallagher

Much has happened since the last edition of The Breeze was published. I apologize for missing a week of The Breeze, but many of us spent many hours with Pete helping and comforting him during his time of need. This edition is in memory of Tootie Gallagher and the happiness, the laughs and the Love that Tootie brought to us all!

Arlene "Tootie" Gallagher, 84, Ventura died Wednesday, April 8, 2009 in a Ventura Hospital following a brief illness.

Born Arlene Agnes, nee, Plosch to Sam and Agnes Plosch, February 24, 1925 in Elizabeth, IL. She was so named "Tootie" by a midwife friend of her mother who liked to play with her tiny toes as a baby. Tootie married Devere "Pete" Gallagher on February 12, 1945. The Gallaghers just celebrated their 64th wedding anniversary. The year following their marriage they moved to Ventura from Illinois Pete and Tootie Gallagher were the owners of Gallaghers Mobil Service station on the corner of Main and Kalorama for 17 years. They then moved to Main and Katherine streets near Loma Vista and renaming the station Gallaghers some time later. Tootie served as office manager for 52 years while Pete was the "front man" and chief mechanic.



The couple retired in 1995. Friends and customers alike remarked that "a better couple you couldnt find." Tootie Gallagher was the past treasurer of the Twin Wheelers Motor Cycle Club, Ventura; honorary member of the Ventura East Rotary Club where she joined husband Pete in active support of the clubs charitable foundation. Tootie was awarded a "Paul Harris Fellow" of Rotary International.

Entombment and services will be April 13th, Monday, noon at Ivy Lawn Memorial Park followed by a memorial service, April 16th, Thursday, 5:30 P.M. in the Ventura Room of the Poinsettia Pavilion, 3451 Foothill

Friends who wish may pay their respects, Easter Sunday, April 12th from 4 to 6:00 P.M. at the Santa Paula Room of the Poinsettia Pavilion where the casket will lie in state. Rotarians bike around Australia

Australian Rotarians have embarked on the longest organized bike ride in their nation's history: a seven-month, 18,000-kilometer (11,200-mile) journey to raise awareness of Rotary, Australian Rotary Health, and the need to fund mental illness research.

The Great Australian Bike Ride is sponsored

by Australian Rotary Health, an RI Board-approved, multidistrict project that raises money for and provides grants to medical and mental health research projects.

"Rotarians welcome any novel opportunity to get involved and to help the community," says Dick White, chair of the event.

Riders took off from Melbourne on 21 March, then took a boat to their first stop, Hobart, Tasmania, looping around the island before returning to the mainland. Over the next seven months, riders will circle the country counterclockwise, stopping in the capital cities of each of Australia's states and territories before ending in Melbourne on 10 October.

Over 100 participants, many of them Rotarians, plan to ride one or more of the nine stages of the course. Five of the riders expect to complete the entire route.

Rotarians helped plan the event by surveying portions of the course and volunteering to find housing for the riders, supply meals, and host fundraisers.

"We hope to have major fundraising events in the capital cities, and large attendances at these would ensure their success," says White.

Event officials welcome additional riders for the remaining stages of the journey and invite Australian Rotary clubs to organize community rides to coincide with the event. Clubs are also encouraged to hold fundraisers to support mental health research.

Hospital receives new lease on life

U.S. and Mexican Rotarians have used a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant to supply a hospital in a poverty-stricken community in Mexico with more than US\$1 million worth of medical equipment.

The Rotary clubs of Iguala, Guerrero, Mexico, and Denver, Colorado, USA, secured a \$19,900 Matching Grant to help the hospital in Teloloapan, which had fallen into The disrepair. clubs collaborated with Project (Commission **CURE** on Urgent Relief and Equipment), a Denverbased organization that focuses on building health sustainable care infrastructures by collecting surplus medical supplies and donating them to developing countries.

Project coordinator Irina Bulkley-Hopkins, a member of the Denver club, reached out to fellow

club member Doug Jackson, the CEO and president of Project CURE, to help solidify the project. After an on-site needs assessment, Project CURE volunteers, many of whom are local Denver Rotarians, collected medical equipment and delivered two 53-foot containers full of supplies



to Teloloapan in July.

State health officials approved a government grant to repair the long-abandoned hospital building after receiving word of the Matching Grant for supplies. The 24-bed hospital now has an X-ray machine, ultrasound technology, and emergency medical equipment. It will provide emergency and general health care for more than 60,000 people in the community.

"This is a home run for Rotary in Mexico," says Jackson. "This is what Project CURE and Rotary live for -- to help those who are in need."

Access to medical care

Before the hospital reopened, the rural region of Teloloapan only had access to a small clinic with one doctor. The medical facility in neighboring Iguala was hours away by footpath and dirt road.

"I feel a tremendous sense of accomplishment because we helped thousands of people gain access to health care that was never available to them before," says Bulkley-Hopkins.

The project ran into a few snags along the way, she says, including one of the containers being held up in customs.

After months of doubt about whether the second container would be allowed into the country, Jackson contacted Margarita Zavala, wife of Mexican President Felipe Calderón, who had worked with Project CURE on several other initiatives in Mexico. Zavala was able to help the container clear customs and reach the hospital in February, Jackson says.

"First Lady Margarita Zavala was thrilled to hear about our project and was eager to help in any way she could," says Jackson. "She is a great person to have on our side for future Project CURE and Rotary projects."

Bulkley-Hopkins said Iguala Rotarians did a tremendous job with logistics after the equipment arrived. Club members prepared required permits and organized meetings with local and state officials. The club also arranged for armed security guards to be present as the supplies were moved into the hospital.

"Accomplishing what we did in Teloloapan is a great example of how Project CURE and Rotary can work together and drastically improve lives. This is a great partnership, and I feel very fortunate to be associated with both," says Jackson. "We're going to save some lives and change the course of history for this community."
