We then listened to a presentation about the Boy's and Girl's club from Nancy Greg-Keller.

Boys & Girls Clubs in Ventura County

Our meeting was graciously hosted by the Boys & Girls Club of Ventura. The Club gave a very informative presentation about all of the benefits that the children, parents, and community receive through the Boys & Girls Clubs. The benefits were quantified in a study authored by Dr. Jamshid Damooei, co-director of the Center for Leadership and Values at California Lutheran University, and Alidad Damooei, vice president of Damooei Global Research. The research was not funded by the Boys & Girls Clubs.

The Clubs provide safe child care so parents can work. 97% of parents agree that their children are safe at the Club. 38% of parents credit the Club for helping them focus at work, knowing they have safe child care. It is reported that parents bring an additional \$144,740,064 in earnings per year to their families as a result of being able to work while their children are at the Club.

The Club places a heavy emphasis on education and the results are evident. 97% of Club members pass the high school exit exam as compared to a pass rate of 70% for the county overall.

Self-esteem and health classes at the Club contribute to a 0% rate of teen pregnancies among Club members. The Club hosts families of many different faiths and Meeting, cont'd from page 3

backgrounds, so it is careful to focus on self-confidence to reduce teen pregnancies as opposed to handing out condoms.

Club members also have a reduced rate of juvenile arrests. Only 4.7% of Club members are arrested, while 9.1% of juveniles in the county are arrested. The Club attributes this to keeping the Clubs open during the pack inversile arises h

during the peak juvenile crime hours of 3-7 pm.

The Club is always looking for volunteers, especially tutors in math and science. In addition to tutors, the Club invites you to come speak to Club members about your education and profession.

Finally, the Club is very excited to be building a permanent building in Saticoy. For the last 13 years, the Saticoy Club has been operating out of a double-wide trailer. However, the Board of Supervisors recently approved funds to build a permanent facility. A celebration to kick-off the expansion will be held on October 15, 2010, at 3:00 p.m. at the Saticoy Center located at 11321 Violeta Street.

Thank you to the Boys & Girls Club for hosting our meeting and providing a well-needed service to the community.

RYLA pals put their skills to good use

Two students who met at a district Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) event used their friendship and talents to help travelers stranded by the volcanic eruption in Iceland in April.

Måns Gårdfeldt and Jonas Larsson became friends at the District 2340 (Sweden) RYLA in 2008. After ash from the volcano grounded more than 100,000 flights and disrupted travel for

millions of passengers, the two alumni collaborated to create a website that offered volcano-related news, car shares, and housing.

"The biggest problem seemed to be the lack of organization from airlines, governments, and transportation companies," says Gårdfeldt, explaining that he and Larsson were moved by stories of distraught travelers. "People were paying extremely expensive taxi trips, and some had no way to get home at all."

The website featured discussion threads for people looking to share rides to destinations across Europe, with ride offers at a variety of prices, says Gårdfeldt.

Word spread quickly. Their website drew 1,500 visitors an hour the first day. After five days, the site registered more than 40,000 visitors and received about 170,000 page views, according to Larsson, a computer programming student.

"We knew it could be something very big if we did it right," says Larsson. "We used Facebook and Twitter to market the website. It was an overnight success."

Their site was mentioned in several newspapers and received radio and TV exposure.

"We had reporters call at every hour of the night, which of course was thrilling," says Gårdfeldt. "It felt really good to succeed and see people use our site."

"Knowing that there were thousands of desperate people out there needing help, it was a wonderful feeling to see them come to our website," says Larsson. "Seeing the connections made by visitors fueled Måns and me to work day in and day out that week."

Because site visitors mainly posted their e-mail or telephone numbers to connect, Gårdfeldt and Larsson don't know exactly how many people they helped, Gårdfeldt says. However, they received confirmation from several people that the site helped them get home.

"We had about 1,000 posts, so we know there were a lot of people who came to the site and organized their travels together," Gårdfeldt says.

Rotarians in their district also noticed their success and brought the two RYLArians to Montréal, Québec, Canada, to share their story with participants at the 2010 International RYLA in June.
