Jeff Hata then announced our speaker, Margo Byrne, Executive Director for the Ventura Family YMCA.

Today's program was a recap of YMCA's <u>Operation Splash</u>. Margo Byrne introduced Amy Bailey and Amber Stevens who walked us through the PowerPoint slides. The \$5,000 check from Rotary East helped them take off with lots of ideas and plans of how to develop this brand new program.

First was the conception of the idea: Who would benefit the most? They considered kids who might not ever come to the "Y" – and their efforts were focused on the homeless and those in transitional living situations.

To find these participants, they reached out to organizations who were involved with these kids, such as Project Understanding and The Kingdom Center. "If we give you free swim lessons, would you come to the YMCA?" After some initial skepticism, the excitement grew and grew.

Now the collaboration began, with Rotary East beginning the project, added to contributions from the Centers for Family Health, YMCA members and others. They discovered, for the most part, these kids did not have swim suits, so how could they take swim lessons? So additional fundraising was undertaken for "swim kits" including swim suits, towels and goggles.

The Swim Kits were another "prize" for the kids, each one individually wrapped and presented to each

child: a gift that they got to unwrap – their very own bathing suit. The kids were excited!

Swim classes included more than just learning to swim. The kids were also taught water safety, sports, stroke development and also core values. The program also began a Fun Friday half way through the series, basically a party at the pool without having lessons too. The kids were also given another gift, t-shirts, which

also promoted the program. They had about 50 kids in each series of lessons, and the kids developed friendships. Thus far, over 250 kids have been trained in four sessions have been completed, training over 250 children. They also had a parent-child swim class, which results in great bonding.

Where do we go from here?

- Make it a permanent program for homeless children
- Keep an annual program
- Increase collaboration
- Assist other YMCAs in developing the program and
- Begin programs outside the City of Ventura.

The program will be featured in the national YMCA magazine, to arrive in mailboxes across the country any day now. And Rotary East will be given credit for its part in the program.

Amber and Amy answered a number of questions from our Club. Margo said this was a great experience for everyone involved and thanked Rotary East for the initiative to come to the "Y" and allow them to develop this program.

What an uplifting program! Three Cheers for the YMCA and Three Cheers for Rotary East!!!

First Rotaract Council to take place 20 May

A Rotaract Council will be held for the first time on 20 May during the Rotaract Preconvention Meeting in New Orleans, Louisiana, USA.

At the three-hour council, which will be modeled after the RI Council on Legislation, Rotaractors who registered for and present at the preconvention meeting will be able to consider and vote on nonbinding resolutions to change program. the Rotaract The Rotaract Council's recommendations will be reviewed by the 2011-12 Rotaract and Interact

Committee, then considered by the RI Board of Directors in September 2011.

A Rotaractor proposed the idea for the Rotaract Council during a question-and-answer session with 2010-11 RI President Ray Klinginsmith at the Rotaract Preconvention Meeting in Montréal, Québec, Canada, in June. Klinginsmith liked the suggestion and moved the proposal forward.

"I'm excited about this, and I think Rotaractors are as well," he said. "This is a recognition of the important role they'll play in the future of Rotaract.

"The Rotaract Council will give Rotaractors the opportunity to make some decisions about which direction the program will go," Klinginsmith added.



Rotaract Resolution Form necessary to propose a resolution. Rotaract clubs should update their club's contact information to make sure they receive future information about the council.

Rotaract clubs will be able to propose up to two resolutions to be considered by the council. Each resolution must include a statement of purpose and effect and may be no longer than two pages. Rotaractors will then have an opportunity to vote online to determine the order of consideration for the resolutions. More details about that vote will be provided later.

Resolutions will only be accepted on six topic areas: Standard Rotaract Club Constitution and Bylaws; Rotaract Statement of Policy; the 18-30 age range for membership; Rotaract alumni activities; Rotaract program name, emblem, and motto; and RI fees and dues for Rotaract clubs and their members.

Although the Rotaract Council will be modeled after the RI Council on Legislation, there will be notable differences. Because all attendees of the preconvention meeting will be eligible to take part, participation will not be geographically representative. Decisions by the Rotaract Council will also be advisory and nonbinding.

Last year, about 300 Rotaractors attended the preconvention meeting in Montréal. Attendance is expected to exceed that for the 2011 preconvention event.

"The creation of the Rotaract Council demonstrates President Klinginsmith's and Rotary International's responsiveness and commitment to Rotaract," said Dong-Joon Lee, chair of the Rotaract and Interact Committee. "Hopefully many Rotaract clubs around the world will actively participate, and in the process shape an even brighter future for Rotaract."
