



# New York Rotarian is a full-time volunteer

Gary Kadow works hard, sleeps little, and talks fast.

That sense of urgency served him well as a volunteer government liaison officer for a Red Cross disaster response team: "I was at the World Trade Center on 9/11 right after the planes hit," he recalls. Kadow published a book about the experience titled 10 Days of Hell and Heroes.

He had started with the Red Cross after a career in government; he'd worked as an administrator for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in New York State and as a special assistant to the secretary of housing in Washington, D.C. In 2005, Kadow and his wife of 44 years, Barbara, decided to head south, settling in the Villages retirement community. "I didn't know a thing about Rotary," he says. "I was always going 80 directions with my hair on fire."

He joined his club in 2007, and by 2010, he was leading a project to send unused medical supplies from Florida hospitals to the U.S. military in Iraq, where his son-in-law was serving, and to Afghanistan. With the support of his club and the Rotary Club of Leesburg, Fla., Kadow turned the effort into a nonprofit called Project SOS – Support Our Soldiers, which has evolved into a local initiative to help homeless veterans and those with disabilities access medical care. The group is also working with the nonprofit Haiti Help Med Plus to equip a hospital in a remote part of that country, and to provide villages with necessities including clean water.

Though formally retired, the 66-year-old Kadow is a full-time volunteer. "When I heard Rotary's motto was Service Above Self, I was sold, because I always lived my life that way."

## Mother and daughter share passion for Rotary

Sometimes the most obvious choices for potential club members are the people we're closest to, "yet we look right past them," says Past District Governor Jennifer Jones, who invited her parents to Rotary activities but hadn't considered asking them to join.

Fortunately, a fellow club member and friend took the initiative. And four years after joining the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, Jennifer's mother, Joyce, is serving as its president.

"I'll never forget my last official task as district governor: inducting my mom into Rotary," says Jennifer. "She had been living Rotary for many years, attending district conferences, taking part in fundraisers, and traveling as a literacy volunteer to Guatemala.

She saw service in action." Joining the club was the natural next step.

While spouses, children, and siblings all are logical choices for Rotary involvement, our parents often are the ones with extra time -- as well as a lifetime of experiences and skills -- to share with Rotary.

"Through Rotary we've shared many special times together, and each of them has been made more memorable because we've done them together," says Jennifer.

### Encouraging service

Jennifer credits her parents with cultivating a sense of service in her. She organized carnivals in the backyard to raise money to fight muscular dystrophy, opened a lemonade stand, made her own greeting cards to sell door-to-door, and collected pop bottles and coins for UNICEF. Through it all, her parents were "there to celebrate the victories, as well as the lessons that were born out of these experiences," says Jennifer.

In October, her mother was there again when Jennifer and her husband, Nick Krayacich -- who is president of the Rotary Club of LaSalle-Centennial -- were inducted into the Arch C. Klumph Society. Her father, John, was unable to attend the ceremony, but Joyce represented them both.

daughter's story," says Joyce. "It was a special time for the two of us."

Jennifer, who is president and CEO of a television production company, has served as club president, governor of District 6400 (part of Ontario and part of Michigan, USA), and district public relations chair.

Among their many activities and projects, Jennifer and Nick -- both Rotary Foundation alumni -- have established an annual peace symposium at Duke University to support Rotary Peace Fellows and to publicize the program. They also are creating a pooled endowment that will generate revenue for their district to use for water projects.

### From "mom" to "president"

As for Joyce, she became involved in her club's literacy and international service committees, helped with club fundraisers, and continued to travel to Guatemala to distribute books to Mayan schools. "When I joined Rotary, I jumped in with both feet," she says.

"If you're going to be a Rotarian, that's the way to do it — don't just take up space on a chair," she declares.

Yet when she was approached about becoming club president, she thought her fellow club members were joking. But she accepted because she didn't want to regret not taking on this important role.

"And I love it!" she says. "I find it such a joy serving our club and serving side by side with my daughter."

Jennifer is also pleased with the arrangement: "All my life she's been my confidante and sounding board. Now, in her role as president, she looks to me for advice. It's added another level of depth to our relationship."



## How to make up a missed meeting

A club member must attend or make up at least 50 percent of regular club meetings in each half of the year (though some clubs may have more stringent requirements). Any missed meetings must be made up within 14 days of a regular meeting. If traveling, club members are encouraged to visit clubs in the new area to make up a missed meeting.

Check the Official Directory or use the Club Locator to get meeting and contact information. Be sure to call or e-mail before you show up for a meeting.

### What to do when you can't find a meeting

Rotarians often wonder what to do if there's not a club where they travel or if an emergency causes them to miss a meeting.

One option is to attend a regular meeting of a local Rotaract club, Interact club, Rotary Community Corps or Rotary Fellowship. Attending one of these meetings counts as a make-up.

Another option is to participate in an interactive activity on a Rotary e-club website. Check with your club secretary and the e-club of interest to learn more.
