Message from our RI President Ron Burton

Dear fellow Rotarians,

Our goal in 2013-14 is to Engage Rotary, Change Lives . All of us know that Rotary has incredible potential to do good work. Meet the Groups in District 5240

District 5240 is organized into 12 Groups that are located in four counties in Southern California. Each month the District website will be featuring information on one of the twelve groups so that you can learn more about what is going on in the District.

Meet Group 4

Group 4 of District 5240 is comprised of five clubs: Thousand Oaks, Thousand Oaks Sunrise, Westlake Village, Westlake Village Sunrise, and Conejo Valley.

Located in the Conejo Valley, the clubs benefit from close proximity to one another with meetings held within a range of 5 miles. Three of the clubs are sunrise clubs and the other two meet at noon. The oldest club is Thousand Oaks, founded in 1958 and the most recent is Westlake Village Sunrise founded in 1985. Each club has evolved their own view of service to the community and to international efforts, but all agreed to join forces for combined efforts to benefit our communities, raise Rotary awareness and to support each other's international projects.

Our Community Service Work Day is a cooperative Group 4 activity to do projects sponsored by the respective cities of Thousand Oaks and Westlake Village the Conejo Valley. Projects have included:

Repairing and painting 87 park benches/ picnic tables at the Conejo Creek North Park and digging over 290 tree wells at 8 different schools to reduce irrigation costs saving the Conejo Recreation and Park District and the schools an estimated \$40,000.

Planting 27 trees at the Yerba Buena Elementary school creating shade for young students and placing sidewalk medallions at 230 locations warning residents

not to dispose of waste that would drain into the Westlake reservoir at an estimated savings of \$20,000.

Both cities recognized the clubs at their respective city council meetings with proclamations.

Youth Services Rotaract/Interact recognition another innovative and highly successful joint effort, now in its third year, promotes our Rotaract and Interact club members at a breakfast. Each of the Rotaract and Interact clubs present their activities for the year and then presents a Paul Harris Award to the member of the school staff most supportive of each club's efforts. Attended by the Mayors, other elected officials, community leaders and over one hundred Rotarians, students and faculty the event has received prominent media coverage.

Beginning in the 2011–2012 Rotary year, Group 4 Vocational Service chairs, recognized citizens in the community who are making a difference. The clubs nominated and voted on individuals and companies for this recognition. The categories are local government, small business, large business and non profits. The dinner honoring them attracts well over 100 Rotarians, community leaders, families and friends and once again raise the image and awareness of Rotary as a vital force in our community.

For the coming year we are looking at what we can do together to impact our surrounding communities from a "hands-on" perspective. Acting together we comprise over 300 Rotarians to tackle whatever the community might need. Some of the activities being considered are more active participation in each others fundraisers, participation by Group 4 in the Story Book Program pioneered by the Thousand Oaks club at the Todd Road Jail facility and the expansion of a Jobs Mentoring Program at the jail as well.

Group 4 is comprised of clubs who have a rich tradition of service within the District and to RI. That service includes 5 past District Governors, an RI Director, two Arch Klumph Society Members, numerous area coordinators, assistant governors and Avenue of Service chairs. Four of the 5 clubs have achieved 100% Paul Harris Fellows status. We have also had 27 members travel to participate in NID's.






